<u>Born:</u> 27th May 1890, South Creake <u>Son of:</u> John Dewson, Farm labourer & Amelia *(nee Vertigans)* of Backhouse Lane, South Creake. <u>1911 Census:</u> single, Agricultural Labourer <u>Military Service:</u> No information found <u>Married:</u> Margaret Hunter, widow *(nee Tuddenham)*, 2nd March, 1919. <u>Died:</u> 7th March, 1976 aged 85 years.

DEWSON JOHN

<u>Military History</u>: Enlisted 9th October 1915 at East Dereham for 4 years, aged 16. His father intervened and a document dated 17th December 1915 states: *Discharged in consequence of his having made a misstatement as to age on enlistment.*

As his name appears on the Roll of Honour it is reasonable to assume that he re-enlisted when older, although no further record has been found of his military service.

Discharged: November 1910 at termination of second period of engagement. <u>1911 Census</u>: Farm labourer living at Bluestone End, South Creake. Re-enlisted: 9th November 1914 for service in UK only. Discharged: 6th March 1919 aged 50 years. Received Army Pension. Died: 17th October, 1943, aged 74 years. Buried: South Creake.
